President's Report

As the 2012/13 season concludes, it is a time to reflect, to build on the positives of the previous year and to address the challenges of the coming season.

The successful recruitment of 24 new members to our Association is a positive and is consistent with the last couple of years. It is hoped that the Ashes series in England will attract even more prospective members for the forthcoming season. Our annual seminar is increasing in popularity with a record number of members benefiting from some excellent presentations from our Coaching Panel, being addressed by our Conducts Commissioner and the Chairman of the Selection Panel and then being treated to International umpire, Bruce Oxenford, as our lunch time speaker.

Always looking at ways to improve the standard of umpiring, a new policy with relation to refresher exams was introduced. Two compulsory exams, one on the laws in August and the other on QC regulations in October were completed. Along with organised, well run monthly coaching sessions, these refresher exams were beneficial as were endorsed by the comments of captains and players on the improved standard of umpiring.

Our First Class Panel of Bruce Oxenford, Damien Mealey, Jay Kangur and Craig Hoffmann continue to represent our Association with distinction. Bruce was appointed to the International Elite Panel and again named Cricket Australia's Umpire of the Year while Damien was the recipient of a National Officiating Scholarship.

Another positive which we continue to build on is our healthy financial situation. This has taken many years of fiscal responsibility by previous

Management Committees and Treasurers. Because of our good financial management and assistance from Q'ld Cricket via the Grants Scheme, the Association has been able to heavily subsidise many benefits for the members over the last few years. Unfortunately. beginning with the 2013/14 season, our Association will not be the beneficiary of any QC grants due to their financial situation. However, with a few cost cutting measures and some fundraising, I, as President am confident that our Association will continue to prosper.

Thanks must be extended to the Social Committee under the leadership of Andrew Moir for their significant fundraising ventures and organisation of social events. Special thanks to this committee and to all members who supported the raffle held for Damien McAndrew's daughter, Charlee.

Our membership numbers have remained fairly constant over the last few years which is pleasing considering that many sporting bodies are drastically declining in numbers. However there is a percentage of members who, after only a few seasons of umpiring do not continue, all for good and valid reasons.

The other main challenge is to increase the attendances at our monthly meetings. People's lives are so hectic now and our communication with members so good, many do not see the need or have the time. Hopefully, this forthcoming season, we can encourage more members to attend our coaching sessions and meetings because there is a lot to be gained.

Although some members can only commit to the Association for a few years, there is a significant number of members who give so much back



to the Association. To all members of the Management Committee, Board of Examination and Coaching, Social Committee and to our Property Officers, QC Delegate, Statistician and Minutes Secretary, a huge thank you.

Just prior to writing this report, Secretary Ross informed me, due to family commitments, that he will be unable to continue in his present role. The Secretary is the life blood of an association and Ross has done a fantastic job. His always friendly, happy manner make him the perfect person to communicate with our members. I, on behalf of all members, wish to thank Ross for the many hours he has given in his capacity as Secretary.

In concluding, the 2012/13 season has been a very humbling one for me. I was honoured, along with Lew Johnson, to have the Association name one of the grade awards after me. Then, thanks to a nomination by our Management Committee, I was the recipient of the Clem Jones Volunteer of the Year Award. As I have said in the past, it is an honour and a privilege to be involved with such a great Association and such wonderful people who I consider my friends.

Management Committee Report



Meetings were held monthly during the season at the Queensland Cricketer's Club. There were 11 meetings between August 2012 and June 2013.

This season was a year of consolidation with the incumbents in all the key positions continuing on in those roles for another season. The only newcomer to the Management Committee this season was Ralston Ambrose.

This season was one of great promise now that the new structure of allocations and observing was bedded down and into its fourth season.

Once again our members were generally happy with their allocations. A number of the younger members pushed their way up the grades and this augurs well for our future.

As was the case last season there has been much more consistency with the observer reports. If any deficiencies were observed on the first observation, they were specifically addressed by the observer on the second observation to ensure the umpire had remedied the problem.

It is very pleasing to see that the standard of umpiring has steadily improved especially in the top three grades. A lot of this can be attributed to the training sessions run by the Board of Examination and Coaching at the Seminar and meetings and the commitment of members.

Communication with the Chairman of the Selection Panel, Col Timmins has been excellent once again. He keeps in touch constantly and is very concerned that the Association is kept up to date and seeks advice from time to time.

The State Umpiring Manager has been very helpful in our dealings with him once again.

Although we had no meeting with Qld Cricket this season our members were rewarded with another \$5 increase in their umpiring allowance.

Handbook

The Handbook is revised each year and our Association has a big say in how it is managed. We have several active umpires from a variety of grades on the Management Committee which ensures that the suggestions for improvements are current and relevant.

We have also taken on board many suggestions from the general membership.

Our President is spending a lot of her spare time liaising with the Grade Cricket Manager, Michel Fisher in updating the handbook.

Recruitment

As the numbers we recruit via the website are quite satisfactory we decided not to advertise for the upcoming season. This resulted in a satisfactory number of new recruits however we lost more experienced umpires than is usually the case. A number indicated that they just wanted a break and will probably return next season.

The workbook has been a great innovation. Although it may appear to be doing things in the wrong order (i.e. testing prospective umpires on



the laws before they're trained.), it has two purposes. Firstly, it acts like an aptitude test to eliminate people who really don't understand cricket. Secondly, it forces them to read the laws which reduces both the intensity and quantity of the training needed as we know they already have a basic knowledge of the laws.

The Management Committee iscurrently reviewing the questions in the workbook to ensure it remains relevant and consistent with the latest MCC Laws which are about to change slightly for next season.

General Meetings

We had an average attendance of 55 at our monthly meetings this season. This is an enormous decline from the last couple seasons where the average attendance was 66. This is extremely disappointing.

It is a constant challenge to try and improve attendance at these important meetings. Those who do attend receive up to date information and training, as well as helpful umpiring tips and camaraderie with their fellow members.

Those who don't attend are actually jeopardising their Cricket Australia Level 2 Accreditation status. As part of an umpire continuing to maintain their Level 2 Accreditation it is a requirement to maintain training as well as standing in games.

We feel it is an essential part of membership of the Association, to

attend as many meetings as possible if members want to get the most out of their umpiring career.

Our constitution demands that we provide minutes and financial statements and reports each month for approval of the membership. We do this as efficiently as possible to allow more time for training and social interaction. All minutes, financial statements and the newsletter were emailed or posted to members in time for each meeting.

This year we had a new chef, Salendar Kumar to cook the sausages at our usual monthly after meeting BBQ. The "bring a plate" Christmas meeting with free drinks was a great success as was the Pizza Night at the March meeting. As an added innovation the chef put on a curry night at our November General Meeting.

The Board of Examination and Coaching used the reports from the Observers as a basis for the training this season, which meant that the training was relevant to what was happening out on the field each weekend. Several times the meeting was split into smaller groups and several different members of the Board of Examination and Coaching were utilised in conducting sessions in an endeavour the keep the presentations fresh.

Merchandise

We continued the current arrangement with for the supply of clothing as this has proved very successful.

Thanks to Murray Branch who will not be continuing next year and also to his Assistant Shaun Sinclair.

General Items

This season it was decided to have two Refresher Exams, one based

on the Laws and one based on the Regulations. This new concept was generally embraced by all members. In the past the Refresher Exam was not compulsory but carried Bob Spence Medal Points. This season with the support of the Selection Panel the Refresher Exam based on the Laws was compulsory for those who wanted to stand in matches during the season. In addition each member had to attain the pass mark of 85% correct before being appointed to any grade games.

The Management Committee have had preliminary discussions with the NT Umpires Association about an exchange program. As their season is in our off season they are very happy for our members to umpire in their competition. We believe we can assist them by bringing their representative in the U17 National Championships to Brisbane to stand here to gain some valuable experience.

Congratulations to our President, Nelma Grout who finally received the recognition she deserves when she was awarded the Clem Jones Volunteer Award at the Peter Burge Medal Dinner.

Conclusion

In my second season as Secretary the support I received from both the Management Committee and members was overwhelming. Thank you all very much.

Nev O'Brien took on the role as our General Meeting Minute Secretary. Regan Neate took on the role of our Delegate to Qld. Cricket. Thank you to both Nev and Regan.

Andrew Moir took the over the reins of the Social Committee. Once again they did an exceptional job especially with the after meeting get togethers which are a fundamental part of our Association General Meetings. I would also like to say a special thank you to Ralston Ambrose who single-handedly administered the raffle that was run to raise money for Charlee McAndrew. Thanks Andrew and your committee for another phenomenal effort this year. It is appreciated by all the members.



Examination and Coaching Panel

Our season kicked off with the Annual Seminar in August. We kept the Seminar as a one day event (due to popular demand) and once again were able to utilise the facilities at Aspley State School for which we are extremely grateful.

The attendance at this year's seminar was again very encouraging with most members making time to attend. The members were presented with stimulating material by the Coaching Panel which helped get our minds back into cricket mode after the winter hibernation.

QC Conduct Commissioner Tony Taylor also addressed the group in relation to the depth of information the Commissioners were looking for in our reports and the procedures they followed when they received a report. We would like to thank Tony for taking time out of his busy schedule for this.

Bruce Oxenford (ICC Elite Panel Member) sacrificed one of his few days at home to attend and spoke to us at lunch time about his experiences on the road as one of the world's leading umpires. Whilst we do not see Bruce all that often these days, he makes himself available to us whenever he can and his participation in days like this is very much appreciated.

Thanks must also go to Nelma, Ross and the Social Committee for their assistance in planning and helping the day run smoothly.

Our Annual Refresher Exam took on a different look this year. We split the Exam into two sections, one on the Laws of Cricket and the other on QC Regulations. The Laws Exam was conducted in August and the Regulations in September. Both were done by way of mail out, with completion being made compulsory for all current umpires. With the agreement of the Selection Panel, failure to complete (and pass) the exams would lead to non-selection. This policy will remain in place in future years as part of holding Level 2 Accreditation is to undertake regular training and examination in the Laws of Cricket.

During the season training sessions are conducted before every General Meeting. The Coaching Panel share this responsibility between them in order to give the members some variety and an insight into the different personality styles among our group. Unfortunately as the year goes on we see numbers at our meetings begin to dwindle and more often than not the complaints we get in relation to our members not knowing Laws and Regulations are about members who do not attend meetings. Over the previous 5 years or so we have not been in a position experience wise to do much about this but this situation has changed with an inflow of experienced umpires from overseas, interstate and country associations. Whilst we appreciate some members have work/study commitments, we will be encouraging the Selection Panel to take training attendance into account when looking at promotion/demotion, particularly in relation to those who do not have a reasonable excuse for not attending.

The meetings between myself and Dave Orchard (State Umpire Coach) continue with coaching methods, changes to CA regulations and local issues being the main topics of discussion. We continue to do our



best to assist each other in identifying areas of concern and formulating ways to improve the delivery of coaching.

Once again Nelma and I were invited to attend a mid-season meeting with the Umpires Selection Panel. It was pleasing to hear there was an overall general feeling that umpiring levels were continuing to improve. There were some minor issues raised during the discussions which were able to be dealt with without fuss.

Thanks go to Patrick Shine for the marking of the Level 2 Accreditation Kits. This is a very tedious and time consuming exercise which Patrick has performed with his normal high level of enthusiasm. Our new umpires this season were given their kits in March with the hope they will all be accredited by the start of next season.

Finally thanks go to the members of the Coaching Panel for their assistance over the past season. Craig Hoffmann, Jay Kangur, Damien Mealey, Patrick Shine and Andrew Willis have all put in extra time and effort to help members on a one-on-one basis and also raise the levels of umpiring in this Association as a whole.

Umpires Allocation and Observers Report



It is with great pleasure I present this report on behalf of the Umpires Allocation Committee and Observers. The other members of the Committee are Michael Ralston, Jim Torpey, Michael Jay and Peter Monaghan.

This season the Committee members observed and produced written reports on 193 umpires. We also changed the layout of the Observers Report. The Observers felt they needed to communicate in more detail to umpires. From the feedback the Observers have received from umpires over all grades, you considered this is an improved form of communication. As the Observers travelled around the grounds in the second half of the season it was very noticeable that most umpires had been, or were working on their field techniques. I would like to thank all umpires who communicated with the Committee this season.

This season we had a total of 114 active umpires. There was an

average of 73 umpires available for selection per round. After allocation, an average of 12 umpires then became unavailable. The Selectors are aware of the increase in home and work pressures we all experience these days; but having approximately one third of active umpires being unavailable each round for selection made allocation very difficult. On the positive side, because of a marked improvement in umpiring standards, the Selectors placed more emphasis at the meetings on trying to give our umpires a path that rewards improved standards.

The Committee would like to sincerely thank all those umpires who helped our new umpires become familiar with Grade Cricket this season; we also appreciated the feedback you gave to the Committee.

The standard of umpiring has improved during the 2012/2013 season. From the results of surveys conducted by Queensland Cricket

in 2009/2010, 57% of respondents indicated dissatisfaction in umpiring; in 2010/2011, 39% indicated their dissatisfaction; in 2011/2012, 23% were unhappy. This season only 17% indicated the standard was below expectations.

A close study of the survey indicated that over all grades the communication from umpires has vastly improved. The 17% of respondents who were dissatisfied with the current standard appeared to be from players who participate in the lower grades.

I would like to express on behalf of all Committee members our thanks to your President Nelma Grout, your Secretary Ross Howard and your Head Coach Peter Boland for their efforts to help improve availability and umpiring standards. Their communication and support with Mike Ralston and myself was very much appreciated.

Training and Development Officer's Report

The number of new recruits this season was down slightly on previous years. We had 12 people commence training in July with another 2 being trained in December. Unfortunately the trend of a number of first year umpires giving up prior to the end of their first season continued with only 8 of these umpiring regularly.

These numbers were off-set this year with the acquisition of a number of experienced umpires from overseas, interstate and country areas. QCU&SA Delegate's Report

The two main themes running through each of the Queensland Cricket (QC) meetings I attended as QCU&SA delegate were:

- the serious financial difficulties experienced by QC; and
- the faith QC has in the 20/20 competition, and in particular the Big Bash League (BBL), to rectify its financial position.

In essence, an extensive review of QC's finances revealed it was in the red in the sum of \$1.3 million. Many factors contributed to this - over some years. The true cash position had been masked by grants or by income received in advance (such as a five year contract payment by Ticketmaster). Revenue from matches at the Gabba has declined since 2002, particularly in relation to test matches against weaker testplaying nations. Sponsorship has dropped significantly since 2009 and the marketing environment is somewhat unpredictable. On the expenditure side, \$800 000 had been spent establishing the Brisbane Heat team for the BBL.

In short, for a long time, QC has been spending more than it has been earning. But the Chairman was very optimistic. He praised the cooperation and generosity of Cricket Australia (CA). QC's accounting vision was hopeful that the debt position would be recovered by 2016. It was said that QC has a plan and the future is positive.

The chairman repeatedly made it very clear that he saw the 20/20 format as the future – both in terms of maintaining the public's interest in the game and in terms of attracting revenue. A lot of QC energy is being invested in the BBL. The Brisbane Heat is being heavily sponsored. Foxtel pay television coverage scored very high ratings and there are high hopes that television rights to the 20/20 format in the future will generate

much income for CA and, indirectly, for QC.

The test and shield formats were discussed but to a much lesser degree.

Umpiring was not discussed to any great extent. It was noted that, as for players, the cost of insurance for umpires is cheaper through QC buying power rather than individually through associations or clubs. There was concern however that a considerable amount of money was paid for the actual umpiring of grade matches and this was seen as expensive for QC. The Chairman said umpires will probably be affected in this area. It was noted that regional members have in the past been responsible themselves for the cost of umpiring.

Other matters included the following:

- Graham Dixon's serious medical condition was acknowledged.
- Changes were made to QC's constitution to bring it into line with the changes recently made by CA to its governance structure. There will be a 12 month review of the relationship between QC and CA.
- The running of games at the Gabba, an expensive undertaking, will no longer be performed by QC but will be taken over by CA. In return, CA will guarantee QC a set income for the coming four to five years. This will relieve QC of the major tasks, costs and risks associated with operating such a venue. These include ticket sales, stadium rental, cleaning, security, police, traffic control, and catering.
- The last test at the Gabba (against South Africa in November 2012) had disappointing attendance numbers on the Friday (although corporate box sales were very high) and suffered a wash-out on the Saturday, the first time a test day there has been completely rained out since 1983.

- Domestic cricket has been suffering losses in the last couple of years.
- QC has reduced the number of its staff.
- After delays caused by financial issues, re-tendering and redesign, the Centre of Excellence building at Albion is due to be completed in October 2013.
- There is a push to involve juniors in cricket. Various ideas were debated and QC decided to contact clubs with a formal survey seeking ideas for growth in this area.
- The Australian women's team won the World Cup and 20/20 competitions and received bonuses from CA.
- There was considerable concern among delegates regarding CA's player payment system and whether it was leading to a reduction in the value of wearing the baggy green.
- The resolution to formally replace Beenleigh Logan Cricket Association Inc with Ipswich Logan Cricket Association Inc was carried.
- Application for associate membership by the Queensland Police Cricket Association Inc was accepted.
- Jim Holding was re-elected as chairman of QC unopposed.
- Carl Rackemann was made a life member of QC. Acknowledged were his contributions as a player for Queensland and Australia, as a board director, as coach of Zimbabwe, and as an advocate for women's cricket and country cricket. Carl spoke in thanks. Referring to his effort at the end of the match that secured Queensland its first Sheffield Shield win, Carl commented dryly: "Helluva' catch wasn't it?".

Grade Committee Report



The Grade Committee for the 2012/13 season was Greg Rowell(Chairman), Bill Brown, Barry Cullen, Pat Culpin, Steven Farrell, Nelma Grout and Grade Cricket Manager, Michael Fisher. For the first time in many years, the Chairman of the Grade Committee was not a Board Member of Q'ld Cricket.

Leading into the 2012/13 season, instead of having all captains attend Custodian of Cricket Nights at Q'ld Cricket, clubs held their own custodian sessions inviting members of the QCU&SA and a Conducts Commissioner to attend.

The format of the season was very similar to the previous one with a slight reduction of limited over games in First and Second Grade. The most significant change to the 2012/13 season was the decision that, in First and Second Grade, there would be separate finals for the 3 formats of the game and that the top four teams in the two day competition would be the teams to play in the end of season finals. In limited over games in First Grade, we saw the use of the white ball, black sight screens and coloured clothing. Another change was the return to U16

for the Lord Taverners Competition which met with mixed reaction from the clubs. All other changes were only minor ones or rewording to further clarify the interpretation of the regulations.

In addition to the Grade Committee meeting on 5 occasions, we were kept busy via emails responding to requests from clubs, ruling on grading and selection of players and making decisions on breaches to the regulations.

In the latter part of the season, the Grade Committee begins planning for the next season by sending out surveys to clubs and players as well as the Chairman and Grade Cricket Manager meeting with the management of all District Clubs. Before the regulations and competition draw are finalised for the 2013/14 season, a Club Forum was held in May.

The Grade Committee moves towards the forthcoming season knowing that all the stakeholders in Grade Cricket have been consulted and given the opportunity to have input into the format and regulations for the next season.

State Umpiring Manager, Queensland

Regional umpiring associations are moving forward with the strong assistance of Queensland Cricket. Recruitment of umpires throughout the State decreased by 4% during 2012 / 2013. Queensland Country associations have still maintained a healthy membership and the reduction in numbers can be reconcilled to some umpires retiring from active on field umpiring. Queensland Associations now have a healthy 1,119 registered active umpires. Preseason new member training has been high on the agenda for many Associations and has provided a steady membership for many zones.

Mid week school carnivals and junior trials have kept the QCU&SA busy with appointments to these fixtures. The Association has performed an excellent job in fulfilling the requirements for all requests, my appreciation goes to Ross and all of his willing helpers.

Queensland Country:

Country seminars have been conducted in Cairns, Mackay, Rockhampton, Emerald, Hervey Bay, Sunshine Coast, Gold Coast, Toowoomba, and the Western Downs, a great effort to progress umpire training from our State Umpire Coach. Country umpires are represented on the State Panel by 16 members who were chosen to officiate at the Australian Country Cricket Championships in Bundaberg in early January 2013. A clearly defined pathway is available for Country Umpires should they wish to commit to umpiring at the highest level. Murray Branch was appointed to officiate at the Imparja Cup tournament in Alice Springs in early February. Murray was an excellent ambassador representing his Association and State. The support for Country Associations through the use of Regional Umpire Coordinators (RUC's) continues to be beneficial for all regions. Regional Umpire Coordinators are used in the seven regions of Queensland dividing the State into:

- Cricket Far North (Cairns to Ingham)
- North Queensland Zone (Townsville to Bowen)
- Mackay / Whitsunday (Mackay and Whitsunday)
- Central Queensland (St. Lawrence to Gladstone)
- Fraser Coast (Bundaberg to Sunshine Coast)
- South East Queensland (Gold Coast to Ipswich)
- Darling Downs and South West (Lockyer to Stanthorpe)

I believe due to this initiative Country umpiring is developing at a faster rate than the Metropolitan Associations. While recruitment throughout the State has not been as successful as I would have liked many Associations continue to recruit and retention is solid. Queensland Crickets support for Regional Umpire Coordinators has helped promote and



develop harmony between local cricket authorities and umpiring associations. The future for country umpires is very bright not only for State Panel selection but also for Grade appointments.

South Queensland Country:

- 15 umpires on the combined State and Supplementary Country Panels.
- Darling Downs / West Moreton zone has increased membership in 2012 / 2013 due to a concerted effort in contacting clubs.
- South Burnett Association continues to have difficulty in recruiting umpires with only 3 regular members making themselves available.
- Ipswich Association continues to do well with 26 active members for the season. Recruitment programs such as information nights are proving to be beneficial.
- Bundaberg region provided positive results for the season with membership increasing by 13.
- Fraser Coast, Gympie and South Burnett are experiencing difficulties with membership and find it difficult to supply one umpire to all matches.

North Queensland Country:

- Umpire recruitment in the North has been moderate with work and family commitments reducing availability for most matches.
- Townsville Umpires Association held regular training meetings throughout the season and have recruited 8 umpires.
- Cricket Far North (CFN) have maintain good membership throughout the season. A proposal to the PNG Cricket Association saw 5 umpires attend the annual seminar. This initiative was a positive step forward in cementing relationships with our Northern neighbour. A similar program has been put forward for the 2013/2014 season. The I C C has seen this proposal in a benefical light for training and development of international umpires on their third (3rd) tier rankings. Preliminary discussions

are in place to have one or two PNG umpires officiate in Brisbane in 2013 / 2014 season.

- Mackay / Whitsunday lifted membership throughout the season and now appoint two umpires per match.
- Central Queensland, Rockhampton and Gladstone, continue to struggle with membership due to the work force commitments required for the area.

Cricket Australia Level 1 Accreditation Scheme:

The Cricket Australia Level 1 training program is progressing well.

- Current numbers of registered Level 1 umpires in Queensland is 1,835.
- Contact will be made in the coming months to invite participation into senior grade umpiring for the 2013 / 2014 season. This recruitment program was initiated in 2011 / 2012 and gained 35 new members. The program was trialled in South East Queensland and as it was successful will be rolled out in all major centres.
- Cricket Australia is happy with the participation numbers achieved with the Level 1 accreditation program in Queensland.
- Queensland had adapted the Level 1 program to an online course as a theoretical training component. At a meeting of State Directors of Umpiring in Melbourne in late April discussions took place to deliver the Level 1 course as an online program. This program will be completed by October 2013 and should reduce the time on staff resources and will negate the need for a State based program.

Cricket Australia Level 2 Accreditation Scheme:

The accreditation program is progressing well throughout the State.

- Accreditation participation has increased steadily to 696 members in Queensland.
- The QCU&SA have conducted an accreditation course for all new members this season.
- Cricket Australia continues to plan a revamp of the Level 2 Accreditation program. This will take the form of an online course and the content will be reduced to cater for the umpire who has joined an Association and completed one full season. It is envisaged this online component will be active within 2 to 3 years.

Cricket Australia Level 3 Accreditation Scheme:

 At a meeting of State Umpire Directors in April discussions centred around the introduction of a Level 3 Accreditation course. Several factors still need to be finalized before further information is released but it is proposed that this course will be offered to umpires who are committed to aspire to First Class level.

Under Age Championships:

• The appointment of Jay Kangur and Jayvan Ruddick - Collins to the respective Cricket Australia National Under 19 and 17 championships has identified two umpires who I believe will serve Queensland with distinction for many years to come. Both umpires performed above expectations on and off the field and were truly excellent ambassadors not only for their State but also for their Association. Reports received from the Cricket Australia UHPP were excellent and indicated the level of support and training that Jay and Jayvan receive from the State Umpire Coach.

Recruitment, Development, Training and Assessments:

- Recruitment for the season throughout the State was 415. This number equates to 184 in the Metropolitan area and 231 in the Country. An extensive ongoing program will be conducted throughout the State from June to September 2013. Queensland Cricket is moving forward in line with the "Strategic Plan for Grade Cricket" development of umpires for the future.
- Winter training sessions are being planned for Brisbane Grade Umpires:
- · New umpire training dates are planned for:

10th July 2013

24th Jul 2013

31st July 2013

15th August 2013

24th August 2013 (Annual Seminar)

Seminars:

Throughout the 2012 / 2013 season many seminars were conducted. As a new initiative the umpiring department sought to go back to the coal face of Cricket Associations in all areas. The SUC travelled extensively from Cairns to Stanthorpe to Chinchilla, Longreach and Mount Isa presenting information nights and mini seminars to cricket and umpire associations. This has revealed a positive, enthusiastic approach to recruitment of umpires in many areas. Similar experiences have been accomplished in other areas. The SUM and SUC will be developing new training programs for seminars in the 2013 / 2014 season.

Player Behaviour:

Throughout the State player behaviour has been of a higher standard in comparison to past seasons. Some Associations have suffered member retirements due to the

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over aggressive manner in which some players approach the game. During meetings with cricket associations, concerns have been aired over the loss of umpire members due to bad behaviour. Signs of improvement in some areas has been evident but is still not at a level where all involved can truly enjoy the game. An increased number of "Code of Conduct" reports have been received during February and March from Brisbane Grade clubs.

Summary:

I am sure we are moving forward in a very positive direction with the strong support of Queensland Cricket and all Associations throughout the State. I am confident with the approved plans, strategies and programs that we have in place that all Associations will benefit and this will be evident with increased membership.

National U/17 Championship

In December, I was lucky enough to represent our association at the U17 National Championships in Hobart. The championship, is contested by each state and territory in Australia over a 10 day period and involves plenty of cricket, formal functions and some time to enjoy the sites and experiences on offer in Hobart.

The championship for me started in unenviable circumstances with my flight out of Brisbane becoming unserviceable, causing a 3 hour delay and me to miss my connecting flight in Melbourne. This in turn causing me to be late for our first team briefing of the tournament!

Once I had been caught up on what I had missed (and my alibi checked out), I was handed my attire for the tournament and sent off to the hotel with the other Umpires. At the hotel, we sorted out the paperwork for the week ahead, spent some time getting to know each other and figured out where we needed to go, what time we needed to meet each other for our first game the next day.

The tournament was structured differently to previous years with their being no T20 games, only two one day games and three two day games, with a rest day being scheduled after every second day of consecutive play. For the umpires on two of three rest days we were lugged off into a board room at 10am for a professional development session. In these sessions we covered topics such as: Preparation, mental toughness, overcoming adversity, goal setting and communication. We were also lucky enough to

spend a couple of hours grilling Tony Hill and Nigel Llong who were the two umpires officiating in the Hobart test match.

Most days included an official debrief, an unofficial debrief and a social dinner with all the umpires. The official



debrief was where issues of laws, conditions and player behaviour were discussed between the umpiring team and the Cricket Australia officials. At the unofficial debrief; mistakes, strange occurrences and other anomalies were discussed in a friendly and completely supportive peer to peer environment. Needless to say, these sessions resulted in a team bond that I will always remember.

All in all the championship was an extremely educational experience, from which I have gained some lifelong friends, learnt a heap about myself and umpiring in general and most importantly was able to participate in an experience that I will always remember. The number one lesson I have learnt from the championship is that we, as umpires can never take our skills for granted and that we must all commit to constant and never ending improvement in all areas of our life if we are to truly succeed in life and our umpiring endeavours.

Peter Burge Medal

Quality Gold Coast all-rounder **Brad Ipson** become just the second Dolphins player to win the Peter Burge Medal for the best player in the XXXX GOLD Premier Grade competition.

The left-arm orthodox spinner and dangerous lower order bat polled 42 votes to finish three clear of Valley paceman Matthew Petrie.

Ipson played 14 of a possible 19 matches and took an impressive 41 wickets at 17.49 while scoring 159 runs at 26.5.

He had a number of standout performances with the ball, headed by a club record 7-21 in the Round 8 one-dayer against Redlands in November, and 5-11 off 13 overs against Ipswich/Logan in another one-dayer. Ipson also took a combined 9-94 off 34 overs in a two-day game against Wynnum-Manly.

His victory was the first by a Gold Coast player since Jeff Pfaff won the Medal in 1996-97.

Ipson enjoyed three consecutive top 10 finishes from 2007-08 to 2009-10, finishing within one top-vote of the leaders on each occasion.

The 32-year-old played one Ryobi Cup game for the XXXX GOLD Queensland Bulls this summer, scoring 33 and taking 0-48 against SA in Adelaide. He has played a total of nine one-dayers and two T20 games for his State.
