Hot Weather

Temperatures are starting to increase in the current season and we need to be mindful of the very hot weather. Please use common sense in games this summer.

If the extreme temperatures that are forecast, eventuate, arrange before the match with the captains, to take extra drinks breaks.



Lightning and Storms

During the remainder of the season we are likely to encounter storms and lightening and as Umpires we need to be mindful of our actions when this eventuates.

If during the suspension of play thunder follows a lightning flash by thirty (30) seconds or less, the thirty (30) minute suspension period is to recommence.

Techniques to consider / Handy Hints:



- When at square leg position yourself so that the building storm is in front of you and not behind. This may mean that instead of being at square leg you go to point. Take a few steps back assuming the fielding side have a point. Please let your partner know as well as the fielding captain/batters at the crease. This shows that you are proactive and a good opportunity to make all aware of what you are doing.
- When off the field, please don't hide away in a room, be present (in a safe area) so that you can monitor further lightning strikes and or change in weather patterns.

Around the Regions

We welcome news for the December issue of the Black and Blue from the Darling Downs South West Queensland (DDSWQ) Zone. We look forward to receiving articles from other regions in future



West Darling Downs South Queensland (DDSWQ) Zone

The Darling Downs South West Zone extends from the Lockyer Valley in the east to all places west to the South Australian border and North to Charleville

Fact the combined area for this zone is some 399,515km2 or approximately 23% of Oueensland. Total Population - 304,704 or approximately 6.5% of Oueensland.

There are **eleven (11)** Affiliated Cricket Associations within this DDSWQ Zone (Lockyer, Toowoomba, Central Downs, Dalby, Warwick, Stanthorpe, Goondiwindi, St George, Chinchilla, Roma and Charleville) with approximately 2500 senior and junior players. Each Association is responsible for organising their cricket activities for their players and many games require considerable distances to travel just to arrive at your location. Each individual association is also responsible for managing player Code of Conducts.

A variety of cricket is played amongst these associations and umpiring numbers are limited at best with many games not even seeing an umpire.

One day games 40 or 50 overs are common for Saturday cricket and when played representative games are 50 over games.

As mentioned above, umpires are a scare commodity, and many factors can contribute to this.

Work is a large contributor, continuing to play and now with the ability to play in over 40 over 50 over 60 and 70 competitive cricket has taken away so many of our potential umpires.

Having taken on the role for DDSWQ zone as an umpire coordinator and working with Lauren Atkinson from Queensland Cricket in a regional umpire coordinator role I find that there are many challenges when it comes to sourcing and maintaining umpires across this large cricketing zone. I also have a role at my local association as the umpire coordinator, so I understand fully the task each week to source enough umpires just for 3 local games per weekend. Normally only enough for one umpire per game.

A recent update from Lauren Atkinson indicated there were over some 1450 umpires across all of Queensland and our zone when analysed had 77 Umpires, yet each association struggles each weekend to find and allocate umpires to games. An interesting part in the analysis was there are many current players who have registered and completed Community Cricket level one with the endeavour to understand the role of the umpire and decisions that have to make

and the processes they endure during a game. It is hoped that when they finish playing there could be a lot more umpires to allocate to games.

Some challenges faced by many as a commitment to cricket include:

- Family Commitment meeting every-day challenges;
- Permanent work which includes Saturday mornings so you might be right for this Saturday but not next when you are rostered to work, or continuing moving to seek employment;
- Farm commitments when the season and climate are right, then time must be spent on income production with on farm work;
- Competing agendas such as junior sports overlapping seasons with Cricket, soccer, football, netball commitments and little athletics. Another large commitment for these country areas is the rural fire brigade and their input not only into their own communities but other areas where they are sent. And we understand how busy the rural fire brigades were last year not only across Queensland, but interstate, as well.
- There is also a requirement to have a certificate to undertake this important role in cricket. Some people that take on umpiring cricket games just have a focus on getting a game of cricket in for those who want A GAME OF Cricket. This is their way of giving back to their associations where they played. This unfortunately is a requirement for insurance coverage.

Therefore, mentoring and support training is important across the zone to encourage new umpires into the fold and to maintain currency of rule and law changes.

This was evident in the recent get together, in September 2020, with Damian Mealey (Former first- class umpire), Bruce Oxenford (current Test Umpire) and Donovan Koch (Currently on first class panel) in Toowoomba prior to the commencement of the Toowoomba Big Bash opening games.

This 2 ½ hour session was conducted in a friendly atmosphere where questions were asked and comments back and forth were well received.

On pitch demonstrations were also well received. Our big thank you to Queensland Cricket, Damian, Bruce and Donovan - hoping to see you again next year.

A couple of comments that stuck with me were both from Bruce Oxenford

- Do not know how you umpire games by yourself (this generally occurs every weekend across the zone apart from representative games).
- Remember when you umpire you could be umpiring someone's test game meaning this might be their only opportunity at this level so you should treat each game you umpire as some ones' test game.



The challenge for me in the next year is to endeavour to work with Queensland Cricket staff, appointed regional umpire coordinators in continuing the development of processes to

- 1. Encourage and support interested men, women, boys and girls into the ranks of umpires for their Associations
- 2. Engage with Queensland Cricket in the creation of opportunities to support and encourage up and coming umpires mentoring in first instance and then as a recent development provide an opportunity to umpire a 2nd grade game in Brisbane with Damien Mealy (Qld Cricket Umpire coordinator). We currently have two umpires from Toowoomba competition nominated to have this opportunity in the current 2020/2021 season
- 3. Seek continued cooperation from Queensland Cricket to have their First-Class panel umpires or first grade umpires available to have information sessions with Communities to encourage and raise awareness of undertaking a umpiring career.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide an overview of the Darling Downs South West Region. It is a large and diverse region and apart from having umpires in each association you can see from the statistics that cricket is very much alive in the bush.

I take this opportunity to wish all a Merry Christmas and a happy new year. The season still has a long time to go, so if all are ready let's call "PLAY", and enjoy the game.
