## TO THE MEMBERS OF THE Q.C.A.UMPIRE'S ASSOCIATION.

It is with cleasure that your Executive Committee presents for your consideration and adoption the Fourth Annual report, which covers the activities of your Association for the past year, together with the Hon. Treasurer's Financial Statement.

1972-1973 proved to be a very busy year for the Association and its is gratifying to know that we have maintained our position as one of the most important organizations, cricketwise. in this State.

## ME-BERSHIP.

Cur financial membership for the past season is recorded as fifty (50) members, but due to retirements only forty-four(44) of such members were available for Umpiring. For the Eighteen rounds of Q.C.A.fixtures we were able to provide an average of 36 members per round. In round 6 we were able to provide 41 Umpires.

#### Amnual Dinner.

The Annual Dinner was held at the Queensland Cricketer's Club and was a most successful function. It was most heartening to see that it was well patronised by Our members A total of fifty were in attendance including invites guests

## Meetings.

Monthly General meetings were held in the Sir leslie Wilson Pavilion and an average of 27 members attended per meeting. Members are requested, if possible, to attend these meetings where they can voice their grieveness and discuss the laws of Cricket.

#### Coaching.

Mr.A.Main, Cur Association Coach, was able, during the season to observe and advise cur new members and to generally ascist them with problems which arose in the course of their matches.

#### Examination Panel.

This panel, during the course of the season, examined Eleven new members. Lectures on the laws of Cricket were given by members of Our Association to various Cricket Clubs, particularly to School boys and their coaches. Generally the lectures were well attended and a great interest was shown by these boys in these lectures.

## Association Tie and Focket Badges.

It is pleasing to note that a majority of members wear the official Association Tie whilst officiating at matches. Members must bear in mind that the only official Pocket Badge is that which is issued by the Dusansland Cricket Association and members are encouraged to wear these items as part of their official uniform. An official Tie-bar is also available to members.

## Experimental Laws.

Experimental laws were introduced again during the season and it is reasonable to expect that the same will be the case for the forthcoming season. All Umpires are urged to corefully study the laws as it is their responsibility to properly interpret and apply the laws. Constant study by the Umpires is the only sure means of gaining the knowledge necessary.

#### Congratulation to Mr.W.Priem.

Congratulations are extended to Mr. Friem on his appointment to the Brisbana Cricket Ground Trust. Our Association now 14.5 two members, moreally Mesors. I. P. Rowan and W. Friem as members of the Trust. Both of these members display their devotion to the game of cricket by offering their knowledge, experience and service for the improvement of Cricket in this State.

#### Retirement of Mr.J. Newcombe.

It is with regret that we received the notification of retirement from umpiring by Mr.J. Newcombe, who in his first class career officiated in Twelve Sheffield Shield matches. It is pleasing to note however that Mr. Newcombe is remaining a member of Cur Association and is prepared to assist the Association and its members to maintain our high standard of performance.

## Umpires Aprointment Panel.

During the season, the appointment of Umpires to Grade matches under the control of the Queensland Cricket Association, was in the hands of the panel comprising Hessrs. W.C.P.Harris, (Chairman) A. Main, I.A. Wash, G. Heirs and T. Fox. The job of this panel is made difficult due to shortage of Umpires. There have been a number of grievences disclosed Juring the past season by Our members due to their continual appointment to lower grade matches, however members must understand that the Appointment Panel operates under the suspices of the Queensland Cricket Association and is not subject to views of members of Cural Association. This Association wishes to record its thanks for the efforts of the members of the Appointment Panel.

## Quaensland Cricket Association.

The appreciation of the members of the Umpires Association is extended to the Executive members of the Queensland Cricket Association, to Hiss Faye Harvey, Secretary of the Association and her staff, to Hr.L.Cooper, Manager of the Queensland Cricketers Club and his staff, for the many ways they assisted the Umpires Association during the past season.

## Players behaviour on the field.

As members are aware there has been a deal of publicity during the past season concerning the behaviour of some players in Grade and first class matches, namely, needling tectics, bad language and other behaviour foreign to Cricket.

The Chairman of the Australian Board of Control for International Cricket said, in January, 1973, "Umpires will be required to report any such occurrence and the Board will not hesitate to take disciplinary action where such is warranted".

The Executive of the Queensland Cricket Association has intimated that they are also concerned about this type of behaviour on the field of play in Cur State and they are determined also that this type of conduct will not be tolerated and will give consideration, when warranted, to take necessary action when such occurrences are reported by Umpires.

As Umpires we have clearly defined roles regarding the conduct of matches and possibily through reluctance to initiate action which could bring about the suspension of players, most of us have been loath to bring these matters to the attention of the Executive Authority.

A dictatorial attitude by Umpires will in no way assist to remody the present position, but a celm and democratic attitude will be more likely to bring about mutual agreement between the players to desist from further conduct foreign to the game in cricket in this State.

#### Conclusion.

Gentlemen, the 1972-73 Season was once again most successful, and this Association can be well pleased with the part it has played in the promotion of Cricket in this State.

It is not possible for any Association to function properly unless it has support from its members. The Executive Committee of this Association is very thankful of the willinh support that it has received from all members during the past season.

I would like to take this optortunity to thank those members who subscribed to the Debenture loans carly in the season when the financial position of Our Association was in a very critical state. Also I would like to thank all members for their support of the raffles which were conducted at Our monthly general meetings.

It was with regret that we received the resignation of Kr. Jack Newcombe early in the season. Umpires with the ability and experience of Jack are indeed very hard to replace.

It was indeed an honour for this Association when our member Mr.Peter Enright was appointed to officiate in his first Test Match. This no doubt will be the start of a long and distinguished Test career. Only with enthusiasm, dedication and complete knowledge of the laws can any Umpire reach the pinnacle and represent his Country.

I would very much like to thank Mr. Tom Warwick for the wonderful assistance he has given to me during this past season. Also a thank you to the other members of the Executive Committee for the enthusiasm and willingness to assist where possible during the season.

All members are urged to strive to improve his efficiency during the coming season.
