



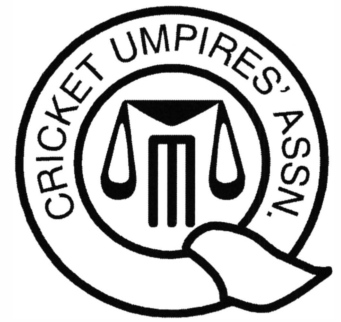

2000/01 was another busy season for our Association, and as your President I found myself living in interesting times.

Happily, membership continues to remain healthy, notwithstanding the usual turnover as some members move on to other things. Our losses were largely offset, as always, by the efforts of our Recruitment and Development Officer, Alan Loynes.

After five years in Recruitment and Development, Alan has elected not to continue in this role. Alan is the second person to fill the job, succeeding Col Bertwistle, and we have been fortunate to have two such diligent cricket enthusiasts in ten years in this important function. I thank Alan for his commitment to the job, and extend best wishes to his successor, Peter Parker.

Perhaps our biggest change of the year was the transfer of the "allocation and payment notification process" from Queensland Cricket. Trevor Musch took on this vital function, and, apart from some minor teething problems, the system ran as smoothly as it has ever done. Well done, Muschy!

The formation of a National Body of Cricket Umpires and Scorers (AACUS) was an issue during the season. One weekend of discussion does not an Association make, but the time has surely come for umpires and scorers to put aside interstate jealousies and develop some meaningful interstate relationships, especially in technical and training matters.

Locally, the big issue has been our input to the Queensland Cricket Strategic Plan. Throughout the season your President and Secretary attended meetings with Queensland Cricket and other interested parties on this subject. Largely at issue is the voting status of our Association in Queensland Cricket. Your Executive will continue to act in your best interests in this matter.

Without Queensland Cricket, there would be no QCU&SA. My thanks to President John McKnoulty and his board, Messrs Graham Dixon and Ian Sturgess, and the staff of Queensland Cricket for their continued unstinting support of our activities.

Thanks also to those of our members who made positive contributions to our Association this year. I especially acknowledge Lew Johnson for his willingness to enhance video assessment of umpires, and to help all our members to improve their game. This must be the way of the future. Glenn Zimmer (Grade Committee), Ross Howard (Delegate to Queensland Cricket), Mark Molesworth (Treasurer), Don White and the Social Committee are also to be congratulated for their achievements and hard work throughout the season.

A President is only as good as his Secretary, and Nelma Grout has, as always spent many hours dealing with the correspondence and affairs of the Association.

Lastly, my thanks to all those members who have offered their support, encouragement and assistance throughout the season. It has been my pleasure to work for you.

## **EXECUTIVE REPORT**

The year 2000 -2001 saw many changes to our Executive Committee. Michael Jay became our new President and we welcomed to the Executive Ray Isherwood (Immediate Past President), Merv Musch and Steve Dean. With the resignations in January of Mel Johnson (Executive Committee) and Jim Torpey (Vice President), their positions were filled by Lew Johnson and Don White.

The Association would like to thank Mike Ralston who has served on the Executive Committee for many years and did not seek re-election.

The Executive Committee met monthly except for the month of April to conduct the business of the Association. The main items of business discussed were as follows:

### **QUEENSLAND CRICKET STRATEGIC PLAN**

Our President and Secretary attended a number of meetings regarding the future direction of cricket in Queensland. Queensland Cricket has recommended that our Association should include as members all umpires officiating throughout the state. Before any changes are made, our body is endeavouring to gain the opinions of umpires statewide.

### **ALLOCATIONS**

Our Association was happy to take over the responsibility of not only allocating umpires to all QCA games but to disseminating the appointments to the individual umpires and co-ordinating the payment of their allowances. This was made possible by Queensland Cricket supplying us with a lap top computer at the start of the season. Thanks are extended to Merv Musch who took on the role of Allocation officer. The new system worked very well due to the efforts of Merv and his liaison with Queensland Cricket.

### **HONORARIUMS**

The Executive Committee introduced honorariums for the positions of Recruitment and Development Officer and Allocation Officer. These two positions involve a considerable amount of time and effort to ensure the smooth running of our Association and the people in these positions should be compensated for their work.

### **RECRUITMENT & DEVELOPMENT OFFICER**

The appointment of this position was moved to the end of the previous season to enable the incumbent to plan his recruiting campaign for the forthcoming season.

### **AUSTRALIAN ASSOCIATION OF UMPIRES AND SCORERS**

During the 2000 - 2001 season, the NSW's Association initiated the formation of a national body for umpires and scorers with the main objectives being a uniform interpretation of the laws of cricket and the sharing of ideas in the training etc. of umpires and scorers. Messrs. Jay and McQuillan were our representatives at the inaugural meeting of the Australian Association of Cricket Umpires and Scorers. Our Association supports in principle the concepts of this national body.

### **SCORERS**

To assist with the recruitment of new scorers, our Association will subsidise the initial cost of their stationery and equipment and also, as with new umpires, reimburse them for the cost of attending our annual seminar and purchase of rule book.

### **GRANT SUBMISSION**

In an effort to continue to improve the training of umpires throughout the State, we have prepared a submission for a grant from the Gaming Machine Community Benefit Fund in order to purchase various items of training equipment.

### **PROPERTY OFFICERS**

Our two Property Officers were again very busy buying and selling merchandise. This season saw the introduction of a business shirt with our badge embroidered on and a new Association tie. Thanks must be extended to Greg Cubit and Steve Dean for their efforts, especially in the selling of merchandise at our meetings.

## MEMBERSHIP

Last season saw a decline in membership to **100**. This comprised of **93** umpires and **7** scorers. It is pleasing that of the 13 living Life Members, three of them are still active umpires and a further four remain very involved in the running of the Association. Although we welcomed **13** new members into our ranks, a total of 25 did not renew their membership.

The end of the 2000/2001 season saw the retirement of one of Australia's longest serving umpires, Ray Isherwood. Ray did the majority of his umpiring in Victoria rising to Test level and achieving Life Membership of the VCA Umpire's Association. After moving to Brisbane he continued his umpiring with the Warehouse Cricket Umpires' Association and also served as their President.

In 1991, Ray joined our Association where he was President for four years and also achieved our 100 Game Badge. All told, Ray has stood in over 300 First Grade games in a career spanning 40 years.

### Australian Sports Medal

The Association was honoured when all living test umpires - Peter Enright, Mick Harvey, Ray Isherwood, Mel Johnson, Tony McQuillan, Peter Parker, Lou Rowan and Colin Timmins received this award. The award was also presented to our long serving Secretary, Nelma Grout.

At our 31st Annual General Meeting, Peter Parker was awarded Life Membership of our Association. Peter joined the umpiring ranks in 1981 after playing for Souths and Wests.

Peter became involved in the administration early in his career joining the Board of Examination and Coaching and serving on this committee for many years. He spent many nights and weekends giving seminars using our own umpiring video. He also served on the Executive as a committee member and Vice President.

In 1985/86, Peter made his First Class debut and in the 1993-94 season, was appointed to his first test match between Australia and New Zealand. During his career, Peter has officiated in 6 Test Matches, 35 One Day Internationals, the Women's and Youth World Cups, 49 Shield Matches which includes 2 Finals and 33 domestic One Day Matches. In spite of his heavy first class commitments, Peter has still managed to stand in 196 grade matches.

During his umpiring career, he won the Bob Spence medal for umpiring achievement in 1989 and has been a finalist for this award for a number of years. In 2000 he received an Australian Sports Medal.

Peter has achieved a lot both for our Association and in his umpiring career. He has been a wonderful ambassador for our Association within Australia and overseas.

**DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING REPORT**

By the time you read this it will be public knowledge that the inaugural National Umpiring Manager, Tony Crafter has retired. Regardless of any criticism, either real or perceived, aimed at the position it is and was infinitely better than the previous arrangement of dealing only with the CEO of the ACB. On behalf of the umpires of Queensland, I salute the giant steps forward made by the ACB via Tony. Manuals, videos, national exams, accreditations are just to name a few of the major initiatives implemented during Tony's reign. Incidentally, you may have noticed the English umpires looking more and more like Australian umpires regarding their positioning. The reason - English umpires for the first time ever are being trained and the major tool of training is the techniques video produced in Melbourne.

Accreditation has reached the stage whereby it will be available from August onwards. The major delay was in the videos, adjusting them to the new laws. Accreditation should not be confused with examinations - they are completely separate identities.

The ACB introduced a supplementary panel which was used in Pura Cup games and ODI'S. Added to this was the mentor system which consisted of the National Panel members. Improvement of umpires in other States where depth was a problem was noted under this system.

The Youth Championships were conducted in Brisbane (U17) and Hobart (U19) and the Queensland representatives Tim Laycock and Bruce Oxenford respectively acquitted themselves very well. Another innovation (yet to be ratified) is the recommendation that each State send one scorer to each of the two National Youth Championships.

The ACB has instituted a Technical Committee to rule on interpretations of laws and any other queries on laws after the NSW meeting regarding a National Umpiring Body.

The application of ACB initiatives by local umpires Associations and Zone co-ordinators (the network) has been very heartening and I thank those 12 or so dedicated workers in the zones for their unswerving loyalty over this past year and in previous years.

Nothing can be done without the very real support of the Country representatives, the QCCA, QCA and of course QCU&SA. I thank you all for your support.

I would like to once again express my appreciation to the Australian Cricket Board and Queensland Cricket for their continued support of our recruiting and training programs.

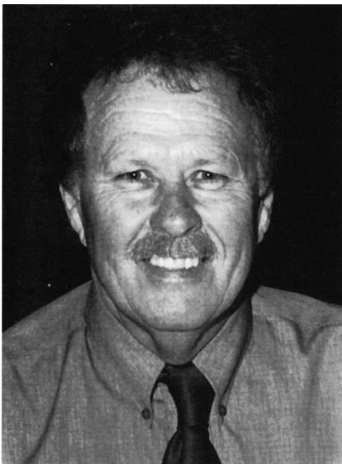

#### Note 1: Accounting Policies:

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to provide accounts which satisfy the requirements of the Queensland Cricket Umpires' and Scorers' Association's Inc. constitution to prepare accounts. The Executive Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity as defined in *Statement of Accounting Concepts 1 "Definition of Reporting Entity"*. Accordingly there is no requirement to apply accounting standards in the preparation and presentation of the report.

Consistent with prior years the Executive Committee has used the cash basis of accounting with additional recognition for the depreciation of the Association's fixed assets. The cash basis of accounting means that income is recognized when cash is actually received, not when it is due to be received, and expenses are recognized when the payments are made rather than when a liability exists.
