The Far North Cricket Region extends from Cardwell in the south all the way up to the tip of Cape York and west beyond Chillagoe. The majority of the cricket played in the far north is centred around Cairns, however Cooktown and Weipa have some participation in the sport, which they do independently.

Cricket in this part of the state is organised and controlled by the Cricket Far North Association (CFN). There are nine registered clubs and associations who provide the grounds and the teams for the CFN Competitions. The Cricket Far North Umpire's Association (CFNUA) provides umpires for these competitions, but solely (due to lack of numbers) for the senior competitions. We have just 12 umpires currently, with three new ones starting this year.

The CFNUA has an exceptionally good working relationship with CFN. We are affiliates of CFN, and we set our own fee structures, assist the CFN Fixtures Sub-Committee in the writing of the playing

conditions and the Code of Behaviour processes, who in turn provide us with full support by allowing our members to participate in subcommittees and reporting at each general meeting. This year for the first time, the President of CFN is also President of the CFNUA!

There are five grades in the CFN competition, which runs from the end of September through to mid-March. We have 1^{st} grade (6 teams), 2^{nd}

Grade (12 teams) and 3rd grade (nine teams) in the men's competition, a five team Ladies competition, and the Jimmy Maher Cup, which is a Tier 3 format for junior cricketers (12 teams).

Our numbers mean we can only manage to



umpire 1st and 2nd Grade with the occasional 3rd Grade match, depending how many umpires we can field at any given weekend. The competition is played over both days of the weekend. We will always provide two umpires for 1st Grade and Semi-finals and Finals, the rest of the time we generally umpire on our own.

There are essentially five grounds outside of the Cairns area upon which we umpire, and these are



some distance away. The longest distance for travel we have is from Cairns to Tully, which takes around two hours (and sometimes more depending on road works etc.). Other venues are Atherton (1 ¹/₄ hours), Innisfail (1 hour), Port Douglas (45 minutes) and Mareeba (45 minutes). Umpires are appointed to the longer drives in such a way that they do not travel too far more than 2 - 3 times in a season (where possible). There are five clubs in the Cairns area, three in the city and one each just 20 minutes or so north and south of the city centre.

Clubs are invoiced each month and payment is made via Direct Deposit into our account. Umpire fees are set at \$1.60 per over if operating solely and \$1.10 per each if we can manage to get two umpires on the park. Umpires are paid their match fees monthly directly into their nominated accounts. We charge clubs a travel fee of \$50.00 per umpire for any trip over an hour and \$40.00 if they are between 45 and 60 minutes. In order to avoid extra costs to these outlying clubs, the travel fees are consolidated across all the clubs.

Most of our umpires live in the Cairns area, although we have 3 living in Atherton. We hold monthly meetings during the season, where we discuss any umpiring issues encountered, and provide some challenges (what would you do if...) and social interaction. This season we will introduce Microsoft Teams so members who cannot make the venue can conference in. The Atherton members have never attended in the past, so we are hoping we can get everyone attending this season. Umpiring in the Far North can be a challenge, apart from the travel. The tropical heat and humidity in the summer can play havoc on our umpires and players. Many have had to leave the field due to heat stress, and we are constantly monitoring the players fitness under these extreme conditions.

Many of us carry our own water on to the field with us, and we have weather policies in place to ensure the players remain hydrated. The new helmet laws have been a challenge as well, as they are extremely hot to wear, and have

Please send any contribution to this newsletter to: Jim Griffith E-mail: jzgg@bigpond.net.au Mobile: 0419 715 697 contributed to a slight rise in heat stressed players. Most of the venues do not have umpire rooms, and we have to change in our cars.

Player behaviour is generally very good, we have only had 6 incident reports - mainly level 2 infringements, in the past two seasons. Our umpires have been informed to let the game flow and to be as invisible as possible, but any breach of the Code of Behaviour must be dealt with. Minor infringements (minimal level 1) are reported on our match sheets after every game, and these reports are sent to the CFN Fixtures committee who keep a record of the infringements. If a player shows poor behaviour at this level consistently, he/she will be reported by the Fixtures committee to the Code of Behaviour Commissioner. All infringements, reports and findings are kept for two seasons on any player, and any repeat infringements in that time are dealt with severely. This process is proving successful in improving player behaviour.

There have been instances of umpires from other areas, including inter-state who have asked if they could umpire some matches whilst on holidays up here, and this is something we have enjoyed, and has been reciprocated.

Thank you for the opportunity to write about cricket in the far north. I look forward to participating with your association in the future, it is something we have been missing across the state – a community of like minds. You are all welcome to contact us if you are up this way. Mind you, lying on a white-bleached sandy cay surrounded by the crystal-clear waters of the great barrier reef, sipping on a coldly whist munching on the sweat meat of a freshly caught crayfish HAS to be a better way of spending holiday time up here!
