PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This year is the start of our 20th year since the current Association was reformed.

We have seen some changes to umpiring during this period. The most significant would be the advent of television into cricket, bringing our decision under the slow motion lens. Whilst this had some detrimental effects, I believe, on the whole, it has brought "the Umpire" to the fore. It has emphasised the special skills required to umpire at the highest level, brought more respect and a higher regard for the difficulties involved in our chosen pastime. I am quite sure this medium will play an even greater role in the future to assist umpires in reducing, what is already, a proven low error rate and hopefully still leave the human touch in the game.

The problem of a shortage of Umpires has not altered during this period. Ex-players still indicate they would not like to take up this important part of this great game. Numerous ways of trying to obtain sufficient numbers to meet the demands has met with mediocre results. It would appear new radical methods may now need trying. In the past I have firmly believed the best Umpires come from those who have played the game and those who take it up voluntarily. But unfortunately, as the last 19 years have proven, there are not enough of these people around. The only answer I can see for the future is to offer umpiring as part-time employment to attract outsiders to umpire. With this must go further monetary reward to encourage them to improve their skills.

We have seen some excellent Umpires from Queensland control matches at International level during this period. Three who stand out are Lou Rowan, Mick Harvey and Mel Johnson. Many others have also helped hold our Association in high esteem at the State level. We now see some younger Umpires rising to higher levels such as Peter Parker to name just one. We also enjoy a number of young Umpires in our ranks at the moment who show great promise.

Player behaviour towards Umpires has deteriorated over the seasons. As we enter our 20th year it is pleasing, from an umpiring point of view, to see this improving. At our last meeting with the Grade Committee indications were that they will be doing a great deal more to improve it further. At this stage most of the responsibility still lies with us. But I am sure that in the future this will not be the case and both administrators and Umpires will work jointly to improve and maintain these standards.

The Association has had many hard working Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers and Executive Committees over this period. They have worked to see the introduction of the Social Committee, training film, Umpires' Observers, our own Allocation Panel and currently moving to assist our country Umpires.

I would like to thank all members of the Executive Committee for their dedication to the Association during the past 12 months. Their guidance has seen the Association through what has been a steady year for all members whilst putting together a new framework

to assist our Association in the future. My sincere thanks also goes to our Secretary Nelma Grout for her total dedication which has made my position as President extremely easy.

On behalf of all members and myself great appreciation is extended to the Social Committee, Umpires' Observers, Coaching Panel, Statistician, Grade Allocation Panel, Q.C.A. Delegate and First Class Panel member for their unselfish work and time given voluntarily during the past year.

Congratulations are extended to Mel Johnson for his International appointments, Peter Parker and Col Bertwistle for their Shield appointments and Tony McQuillan for winning this year's Bob Spence Medal.

Finally I would like to thank all members for their support and assistance during this year.

LIFE MEMBER - 1987

At the Eighteenth Annual General Meeting, Trevor (Merv) Musch was made a Life Member. Merv joined the Association in the 1975/76 season after answering a newspaper advertisement for Umpires.

Merv who started umpiring in the lower Grades won promotion up the Grades and has been umpiring First Grade since 1977/78. He was eligible for his First Grade Badge when they were introduced. Merv was also appointed to two City - Country Colts games and one Interstate Colts game between New South Wales and Victoria.

Since 1977, Merv has continually served on the Executive Committee, having held the positions of Vice-President, Executive Committee Member and has been Treasurer since 1984. In addition, he has also been Delegate to the Q.C.A., served on the Allocation Panel, been Umpires' Observer and has been on the Examination and Coaching Panel for a number of years.

In the 1984/85 season, Merv was the inaugural winner of the Bob Spence Medal.

We congratulate Merv Musch on this well deserved honour and look forward to his continued involvement in the Association.

EXECUTIVE REPORT

The Executive Committee met on 11 occasions since the last Annual General Meeting and attendances were as follows:

New members to the Executive Committee were Tony McQuillan and Jim Taylor.

The 1987/88 season saw players in First and Second Grade having to wear spikes; players being allowed to wear specified logos on some of their clothing and equipment; the markings for the "danger area" being shown on all pitches; and the Gabba Sporting Products Competition following the same rules as the McDonald's Cup. Umpires' allowances were increased to \$30.00 per day with a partner and \$35.00 alone.

In May, 1988 members of the Executive Committee had a very successful meeting with the Brisbane Grade Committee. The main items discussed were: the need for the replacement law to be clarified; over rates in the Semi-Finals and Finals; that adjournments be extended to 20 minutes in the lower Grades; and the availability of amenities at school grounds.

The Executive Committee has again spent a considerable amount of time this year on the Constitution of the Queensland Cricket Umpires' Association. Delays were experienced in getting the Q.C.A.'s approval for the Q.C.U.A. Constitution and significant changes had to be made to the draft Constitution after it was perused by after the members.

A Special General Meeting has been called in July to propose the Q.C.U.A. Constitution. The major purpose of the amendments is to formally enable the dissemination of information to Cricket Umpires' Associations throughout Queensland.

Sincere thanks must be extended to Radio Station FM104 for their generous donation of \$500.00. The majority of this money will be used to conduct pre-season seminars. In the forthcoming season, in addition to a seminar for new and prospective members, an advanced seminar will be held for First and Second Grade Umpires.

The 1987/88 season saw the advent of an Umpirers' casual shirt which is lemon in colour with our badge embroidered on the left hand side. These shirts have proved very popular with the majority of members purchasing at least one at a cost of \$20.00 each.

A project of the Executive Committee during the latter half of the 1987/88 season has been to have an Honour Board made. The Brisbane Cricket Ground Trust has very kindly given permission for the Honour Board to be placed in the Players' Dining Room.

This season, saw the Association take out a Public Liability Cover of \$1,000,000.00 on all members. The premium per member was \$4.60.

The Newsletter "Black and White" continued in the 1987/88 season with six editions being published. The Newsletter has endeavoured to keep members informed about what is happening within the Association and Q.C.A. District Cricket.

About 10 years ago, the Federation of Cricket Umpires was formed and three biennial conferences were held and a magazine "Over" was published a few times each year. During the last three years, the role of the F.A.C.U. has declined and this year the Association decided to vote against the continuation of the F.A.C.U.

In June, 1988, Mr. Peter Parker attended an A.C.B. Umpires' Meeting. As a result of this meeting, the Australian Cricket Board is endeavouring to reintroduce an Umpires' advisor in each State. The topics discussed were: coaching and training, payment of Umpires, Captains' reports, recruitment of Umpires, allocation of Umpires, major reports and differing interpretations of laws.

As 1988/89 is the Association's 20th year, the Executive Committee approached Mr. Tom Warwick, a Life Member and past Secretary/Treasurer, to investigate and report on the history of our Association. Mr. Warwick has kindly accepted our invitation and hopes to have the history completed by our Annual General Meeting.

Plans are already underway to commemorate our 20th year. A 20th Anniversary Dinner will be held on Saturday, the 29th October, 1988, at the Queensland Cricketers' Club.

During the off season, the Executive Committee has begun to compile a Ground Directory which will be available to all members at the commencement of the 1988/89 season. The Directory will contain information on all Q.C.A. grounds.

To assist the Secretary, a Minutes Secretary was appointed. Thanks are extended to Mr. Tony McQuillan who has ably filled this position.

Finally, our thanks go to the Q.C.A. and their staff, the Brisbane Grade Committee and the Conducts Committee for their assistance and co-operation throughout the year.

THE BOB SPENCE MEDAL

There was only some minor changes made to the Rules for the 1987/88 season. These changes were:

- (a) the Umpire's average mark was calculated by the total points received divided by the number of Captains' reports received.
- (b) the definition of Sunday games was clarified.
- (c) new members to receive a half point for the August meeting if they join at the September meeting.

A new perpetual trophy was purchased this season and the previous three winners' names were engraved on the trophy. During the off season, ten individual medal display stands have been made and are to be distributed to our four winners to date.

Unfortunately, our Patron, Mr. Bob Spence was unable to present the medal this year because he had a bad fall only a few days prior to our Dinner. In May, Bob subsequently had a further fall and broke his leg. He is now convalescing in Mt. Olivet Hospital. The Association wishes Bob a full and successful recovery.

At the Umpires' Annual Dinner, our President announced the top seven contenders for the Medal - Marita Anderson, Col Bertwistle, Brian Edwards, Michael Hearn, Tony McQuillan, Peter Parker and Don Payne. This was followed by the presentation of the medal by Mr. Wep Harris to the winner, Mr. Tony McQuillan. The Association congratulates Tony on winning the award.

Tony joined the Association in the 1976/77 season and progressed to First Grade in only seven games. He was appointed to the Queensland v Sri Lanka game and a McDonald's Cup game in the 1985/86 season and also officiated in two interstate Colts games. Tony is now a member of the Executive Committee and has been a member of the Examination and Coaching Panel.

Thanks are extended to Wep Harris, Secretary of University Club and Grade Committee member for performing the medal presentation in the absence of Mr. Spence.

Thanks are also conveyed to John and Narelle King, for collating the statistics for the award. The collation of these points took a great deal of time and effort and was greatly appreciated by the members.

MEMBERSHIP

The 1987/88 season was a steady one with regard to membership. Our 64 members includes 56 ordinary members and eight Life Members. Unfortunately, for various reasons, 13 members did not renew their membership for the 1987/88 season. Also nine new members joined the Association during the season.

Fifty-one members officiated in one or more Q.C.A. fixture games - although the number of new members and active members has decreased, the average number of Umpires per Round has again increased which is very pleasing.

Thanks are extended to those Umpires who were available for Sunday games. All Sunday games received a full compliment of Umpires with 18 Umpires officiating in the Gabba Sporting Products games and the same number officiating in the Under 19 Competition.

The number of members who officiated in all Q.C.A. fixture Rounds increased to 14 this season. Congratulations and sincere thanks are extended to these members.

Congratulations are extended to the following members:

- * Colin Timmins made his international debut in the Benson & Hedges World Series Cup game between New Zealand and Sri Lanka.
- * Peter Parker officiated in the World Youth Cup.
- * Col Bertwistle was appointed to his maiden First Class game in January between Queensland and Tasmania.
- * Bruce Edmunds, Laurie Hallam, Phil Latimer, Paul Polkinghorne, Mike Ralston, Peter Rook, Tony Walsh and Barry Westphal made their First Grade debut this season.

Our members were asked to officiate at several games and carnivals throughout the season including pre-season trial games, Police and Army games, the Under 19 trials and Australian Under 19 Championships, the Australian Deaf games, Under 17 Elite Squad games and the Christian Brothers Carnival. We also assisted the Queensland Women's Cricket Association by officiating in their Finals.

Congratulations are also extended to Steve and Karen Lanigan on the birth of their first child in December.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE REPORT

Although all members of the Social Committee were new this year, this Committee was very successful both socially and financially.

The main objective of the Committee was to raise enough money during the season to subsidise the Umpires' End of Season Dinner. This objective was easily achieved. The greatest fund raiser this season was raffles. Raffles were run at the majority of monthly general meetings with prizes being generously donated by some of our members. The major raffle was the Christmas raffle with a basket of alcohol valued at \$200.00 being first prize. All members received a book of ten tickets at a cost of one dollar each.

Over \$600.00 profit was made from raffles. Thanks are extended to those members who donated raffle prizes or made a contribution to the Christmas raffle.

The other main avenue for funds was the Gold Lotto Draw which ran over ten weeks. The majority of numbers were sold at \$10.00 a number. Prize money for each draw was \$20.00 with an additional draw with prize money of \$50.00 being held at the December meeting. The Gold Lotto Draw yielded \$200.00 profit.

On the social side, the Committee organised two functions - the Christmas Party and the End of Season Dinner.

An early Christmas Party was held at Nelma's place on the 15th November. The 40 people who attended enjoyed a cold meat and salad buffet lunch at a cost of \$5.00 per person or \$12.00 per family. A very relaxing and pleasant day was had by all.

The highlight of our season is always the End of Season Dinner Dance which this year was held at Lennons Hotel on the 9th April and attended by 56 people. Everyone at the dinner enjoyed excellent company, food, drink and music for a cost of \$28.00.

On the 13th December, the Annual Cricket Match against Valleys was played on the Norm McMahan Oval. Although our performance has improved, we were again defeated by Valleys.

Thanks are extended to Valleys for their hospitality extended to our members.

In conclusion, thanks are extended to the members of the Social Committee and their wives for their excellent work and also to members for their attendance at functions and their support.

UMPIRES' ALLOCATION PANEL

The Allocation Panel enjoyed a busy but successful season. In addition to allocating Umpires to the 12 Q.C.A. fixture games, the five Gabba Sporting Products games, the four Under 19 games, Semi-Finals and Finals, the panel appointed Umpires to the Australian Under 19 Carnival, the Christian Brothers Carnival and the Queensland Country v Colts game.

The average number of Umpires who officiated each Saturday during the season was 41. This is a slight increase. The number of umpires allocated each Round were: Round 1 - 41, Round 2 - 29, Round 3 - 44, Round 4 - 39, Round 5 - 36, Round 6 - 40, Round 7 - 40, Round 8 - 37, Round 9 - 41, Round 10 - 48, Round 11 - 43 and Round 12 - 40.

The 1987/88 season again saw all Gabba Sporting Products games and Under 19 games being provided with umpires. It is pleasing to report that for the majority of Sunday games there was an excess of umpires available. The Allocation Panel would like to thank members for their commitment to umpiring especially to those umpires who were available for all Q.C.A. fixture and Sunday games.

Unfortunately, there was a shortage of experienced umpires in the top Grades this season due to a very full First Class season, work commitments and some retirements. As a result, eight members were appointed to their maiden First Grade game during the season.

As in the previous season, umpires in the lower Grades were rotated in the first nine Rounds so that all Grades received the benefit of umpires during the season. In the remaining three Rounds, umpires were appointed to the crucial games in every Grade.

The Umpires' Observers worked closely with the Panel and their comments were very helpful.

Sincere thanks are extended to Ian Sturgess and Christine Barry at the Q.C.A. for their assistance throughout the season.

THE UMPIRES' OBSERVERS
AN APPRECIATION OF THE 1987/88 SEASON

Having umpired for many seasons it can be easy to slip into minor criticisms of fellow Umpires' performances. During this last season your two Observers have endeavoured to approach their obligations with frequent consultations and a desire to extract some useful yardsticks to apply in their reports.

It was evident that the Association has a nucleus of solid strength to provide continuous adequate service if we can retain our present members and can recruit further members of the calibre of the season's new arrivals. Coverage of games at all Grades and venues was carried out to give both support where needed and to comment on the state of grounds and facilities available or desired.

The standard of dress observed during the season did members credit. It does help to exude confidence. Some lack of confidence was seen on occasions and seemed to stem from a loss of concentration and, in some cases, from insufficient knowledge of some of the Laws of Cricket and their interpretation. Fortunately these occasions were in the minority but while they occur it emphasises the need to remind members that there is always room for revision and improvement.

The Observers are pleased to report that co-operation from Umpires was both helpful and appreciated. We are not adverse to being proved wrong if that occasion arises as any such discussion helps make you a better Umpire. We have worked throughout the season to do just that.

The Recruitment Committee met on two occasions early in the season. As a result of these meetings, an advertisement for Umpires was placed in the Courier Mail and Peter Parker was interviewed on Sports Scene. A pre-season seminar was organised for the 5th September.

The Q.C.A. allocated \$1,000.00 for the recruitment of Umpires this season. For this, we are most appreciative.

BOARD OF EXAMINATION AND COACHING

Once again the Panel was quite active conducting seminars for members and other interested parties.

Seminars were conducted for Wide Bay Umpires' Association in Maryborough, Queensland, Women's Cricket Association, North East Junior Cricket Association, Mt. Gravatt C.A.E., Gympie Cricket Association, Beenleigh Umpires' Association, and Church Union.

At the majority of meetings, the panel held coaching sessions. At the January General Meeting they invited Sports Trainer, Bob Pfingst, who spoke on the physical aspects of umpiring. This talk was well received by the members.

The support of members in assisting the Panel was most gratefully accepted and should become an ongoing expectation.

So that the Panel could be easily identified at seminars, the Association equipped them with distinctive track suits.

The overall poor attendance at our pre-season seminars has led to a new approach hopefully this season. It is proposed to hold the pre-season seminar for new and prospective Umpires at night rather than on a weekend. Also, an advanced seminar will be conducted for First and Second Grade Umpires prior to the 1988/89 season.

The Panel is in the throws of producing a correspondence course for the express use of country members. This documentation should be available in the forthcoming season.

The Panel feels that the old evergreen "Please read the Rule Book" is still the first and most important thing that each and every Umpire must do.

The Examination and Coaching Panel would like to take the opportunity to thank all members for their support and wish you a successful and improved season in 1988/89.
